DEDICATION

ELAINE HOULE LEARY was born in Houghton, Michigan, December 9, 1911, daughter of Chloa Clifford and Albert J. Houle, long-time residents of Cochise County. Elaine and her sister Louise went to school in Douglas, graduating from high school there in the '20's. Louise, married to Dr. J.S. Walsh, died in 1968.

Their mother Chloa Clifford, was born in St. David, Cochise County, September 12, 1884; her family moved to Pearce in 1894; she met Albert J. Houle there and they married in 1905. The Houles moved from Pearce to Michigan where they lived for a few years, then to Mexico where Mr. Houle was a mining engineer. In 1930 they moved to Douglas. Mr. Houle died in 1943 and Mrs. Houle in 1980.

Jack Leary's mother was born at Fort Apache, Arizona in 1876 while her father was stationed there with the cavalry. Three generations West Point, Jack was ever eager to retrace his father and grandfather's footsteps and was glad, therefore, to be stationed in Douglas at Camp Harry J. Jones from September 1931 through December 1932. His next assignment was Fort Huachuca, where Elaine's father was assistant to the Post construction quartermaster.

Elaine and Jack met in Douglas in 1932 during her spring vacation from college; they were married August 30, 1933 at The Presidio in San Francisco. Upon Jack's retirement in 1961, they settled in Douglas to be near her mother and sister, residing there until January 1981, when they moved to Fallbrook, California, where Elaine died August 19, 1981.

This book is dedicated in loving memory to ELAINE HOULE LEARY.

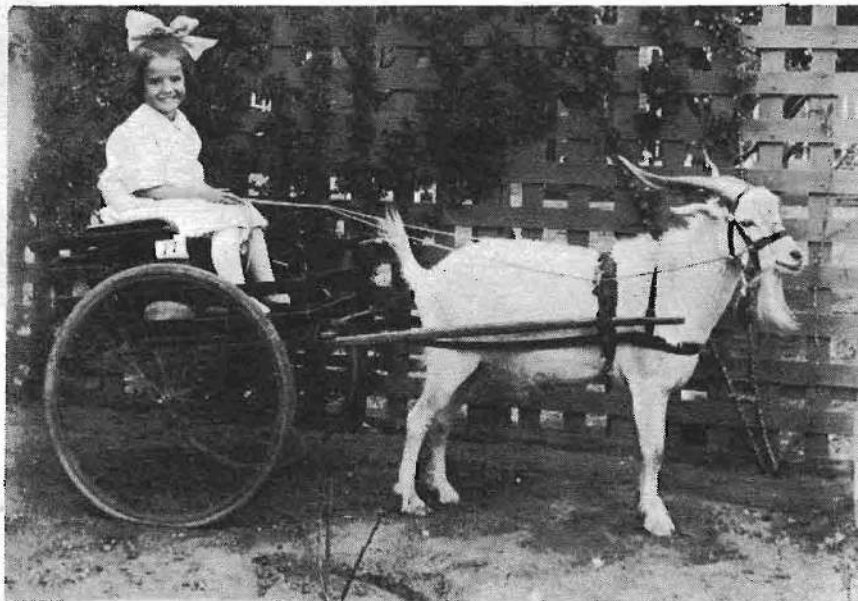

Fun on Wheels

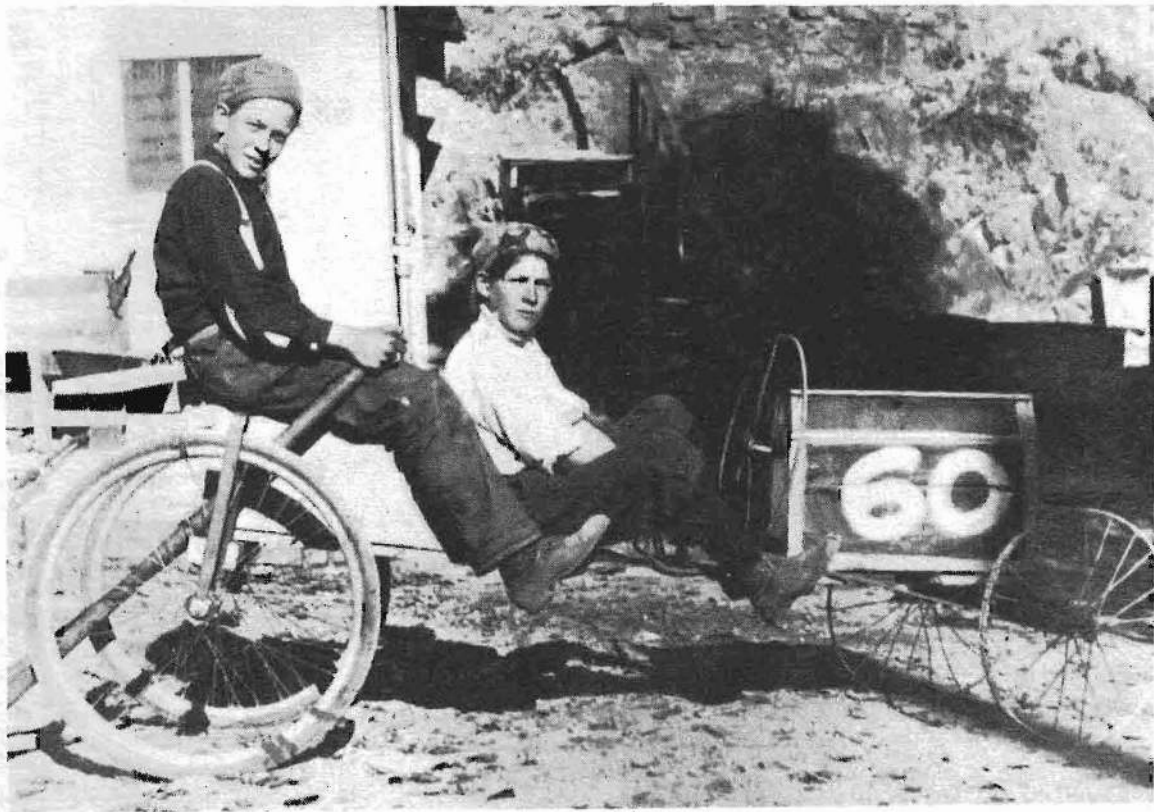
